#### 14. Program Performance

#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The use of state funds to construct the intersection improvements along the Belle Terre Pkwy. corridor will have the specific purpose of improving safety by providing dedicated right turn lanes and thus reducing the potential for rear-end collisions. Providing for the dedicated turn lanes will also improve level of service and delays along the corridor caused by turning vehicles. The median opening of Pine Grove Drive, an historic site of fatal crashes, will be closed.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



The requested funds will fund the construction of a project as described above.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The end result of the project will include a safer corridor and a reduction in delay due to the construction of turn-lanes.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will serve all users of Belle Terre Pkwy. along the segments covered by the funding. The 2021 traffic count shows that approximately 30,000 vehicles per day use this segment of Belle Terre Pkwy.

## e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of the project is a reduction in rear-end crashes; the reduction of fatal collisions. This metric can be measured by the number of crashes before and after the implementation of the project.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
