14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds being requested will allow the Florida HIPPY Training & Technical Assistance Center to manage the delivery of the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) to 2,000 children in Florida. This level of HIPPY funding has been provided by the Legislature since FY 2014-2015 (with the exception of FY 17-18) and if it is not provided again in FY 2023-24, it will result in over 500 fewer families receiving HIPPY services than in prior years.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Florida Training & Technical Assistance Center (1) is the state authority and liaison between program sites, their agencies, the University of South Florida, and the national HIPPY USA office; (2) manages contracts, budgets, invoicing, and audits for all sites; (3) prepares and tracks participation in online training modules, professional development, conferences, and other opportunities for growth and development of coordinators and home visitors; and (4) is responsible for data collection.

- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
- (1) Home Visitors are typically community members and former parents in the program trained to use peer-to-peer mentoring and share community resources that (2) empower parents to act as their children's first teachers and advocates. (3) TANF-eligible families are provided with training and developmentally appropriate materials, curriculum, and books at no cost. Then, because of the HIPPY Role Play Instructional Technique, (4) parents are vested in engaging the educationally enriching activities.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, developmentally disabled individuals, and preschool students. Approx. 2,000 individuals to be served.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
- (1) At least 75% of parents who complete a curricular year will report an increase in the families' engagement in outdoor or physical activities and cultural events as a result of participating in the HIPPY Program. Parent involvement survey administered upon enrollment into the program and at the end of each curricular year. (2) Create specific immediate job opportunities measured by home Home Visitor survey administered upon enrollment into the program and at the end of each curricular year. (3) Enhance specific individual's economic self sufficiency measured with Parent Involvement Survey and Home Visitor survey administered upon enrollment into the program.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The contract manager will review the progress made on the activities and deliverable and if the contractor fails to meet and comply with the deliverables listed in the contract or to make appropriate progress the Contract Manager may approve a reduced payment or request the Contractor to redo the work or withhold payment or if necessary terminate the contract.
