The Fire Watch is Florida's fight to end veteran suicide. It is doing so by building an early intervention network of community gatekeepers trained to identify veterans in crisis and direct them to the resources they need. Based on CPR and funded largely by the State of Florida, the "Watch Stander" program reached 3,000 participants in 2022 and is on track for 5,000 by year end 2023. The program is implemented in partnership with FDVA and the Florida Governor's Challenge to End Veteran Suicide.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Fire Watch is Florida's fight to end veteran suicide. It is doing so by building an early intervention network of community gatekeepers trained to identify veterans in crisis and direct them to the resources they need. Based on CPR and funded largely by the State of Florida, the "Watch Stander" program reached 3,000 participants in 2022 and is on track for 5,000 by year end 2023. The program is implemented in partnership with FDVA and the Florida Governor's Challenge to End Veteran Suicide.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

State funding will support the Fire Watch effort to grow our statewide early intervention network of Gatekeeper volunteers trained to direct at-risk veterans to the resources they need. This "Watch Stander" program is a fundamental initiative of FDVA's Governors Challenge to end veteran suicide.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The trained network of Watch Stander volunteers identify risk signs of veterans in crisis and direct those veterans to the help and resources they need. Based on CPR and with State funding from the most recent fiscal year, this program is available in all 67 counties in Florida and numbers more than 3,000 trained participants. The goal is 5,000 by year end 2023.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes our more 1.5 million U.S. military veterans residing in Florida. The project will serve 800+ people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Our programs are focused on "Promoting Connectedness" and "Strengthening Access to and Delivery of Suicide Care Resources", consistent with the CDC's suicide prevention logic model. Short term measure (1 year) is to increase our early intervention network of community members by 2,000 Watch Standers. Long term (3 years) measure is to reduce veteran suicides in Florida by 20%. Short term (1 year) is to increase our early intervention network of community members by 2,000. We maintain records of every trained individual. As of 12 December 2022, we have 3,000 Watch Standers. The goal is 5,000 at the end of 2023. Long term (3 year): To be measured against the baseline 2019 Florida veteran suicide data we collected in partnership with NLP Logix.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Performance measures would be quarterly milestones tied to veteran suicide prevention program deliverables, including ROI reports toward specific 1-year measurables noted in section 19 of this document. Funding could be provided in quarterly increments and discontinued or withheld unless progress reports are submitted.
