### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will secure community based employment training for individuals with intellectual disabilities and autism. With an ultimate goal of employment, individuals with special needs will reduce their dependence on government subsidies.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

JARC will work with local businesses to secure partnerships for the community based employment training. Individuals with intellectual disabilities and autism will receive job coaching services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Participants in the program will be provided the opportunity to receive community based employment training at local businesses. This will be completed with supervision from trained job coaches to maximize the potential for independent employment.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This program provides services to individuals with intellectual disabilities and autism. We also provide support to the families of the individuals receiving services. The program has grown every year, and currently provides services to 60 individuals and their families.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

75-100 individuals with intellectual disabilities and autism will participate in community based employment training. They will also receive training in how to develop a resume and how to interact in a job interview. A minimum of 6 individuals will become employed at the community based training site. Success is measured in the number of individuals enrolled in the program, the number of local business partners and the number of individuals who become employed.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Financial penalties will be tied to each benchmark/objective as determined by the Department of Economic Opportunity.
