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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The sheriffs of the counties comprising the U.S. Census Bureau Tallahassee Metropolitan Statistical Area (TMSA) have joined together to support regional crime-fighting programs such as "Deputies without Borders" and the "North Star Drug Task Force." The Leon County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) is seeking to expand its locally-funded services within the TMSA using existing collaborative agreements to commit more resources to combating drug and firearms crimes.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will support 3 full-time detective positions assigned to investigate crimes involving fentanyl and other dangerous opiods, the drug trade, and associated firearms crimes within the TMSA. Cases that meet HIDTA case criteria will be referred. TMSA agencies will initiate comparatively more investigations, execute more related search warrants, and seize more fentanyl and illegal firearms.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Thorough investigation of crimes involving fentanyl and other dangerous opiods, the drug trade, and associated firearms crimes within the TMSA will drive down the occurrences of these incidents, lead to an enhanced sense of safety among members of the general public, and reduce the number of senseless deaths related to these problems.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Fentanyl and other dangerous opiods, the drug trade, and associated firearms crimes take too many lives in Florida each year. Such crimes are solved through the initiation of drug investigations and the service of search warrants. These investigations will drive down the occurrences of such incidents, lead to enhanced sense of safety among the public, and reduce incident recurrence and deaths. Success will be measured by the reduction of overdose deaths within the TMSA.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard penalties are appropriate. Return of appropriations.
