14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Miami-Dade Fire Rescue (MDFR) will install (8) plugin electric vehicle charging stations at (2) MDFR fire stations to promote the continual transition from "tailpipe", fossil fuel combustion to an electrically-charged fleet. This will continue supporting the move towards more sustainable energy sources in MDFR and give first responders the benefit of charging their county vehicles at fire stations in Miami-Dade County.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project will install (8) electric vehicle charging ports at (2) MDFR fire stations for the use of MDFR county and fleet vehicles, assisting in the transition towards more sustainable and environmentally-friendly energy sources. This gives first responders the benefit of charging their county and emergency response vehicles at fire stations across Miami-Dade County.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Installing (8) charging ports at (2) MDFR fire stations will produce less fossil fuel emission from county vehicles, as they will be utilizing alternative fueling sources that do not require the use of combustible energy. Citizens of Miami-Dade County can then benefit from a cleaner and sustainable environment, which can assist with lowering fuel costs, promote better air quality, and increase ecological preservation and protection within the county.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Miami-Dade County, specifically MDFR, which is about 2.7 million residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Allowing MDFR first responders, as well as other personnel, to charge their county and emergency response electric vehicles at fire stations will offer staff more locations to power their county electric vehicle, while continuing the promotion of sustainable energy and resources regarding transportation. This will ease the burden that fossil fuel energy sources cause to the environment and wildlife, giving Miami-Dade County citizens the protection and support from MDFR regarding climate change and use of sustainable energy sources.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
