### 14. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose and goal of the Figgers Tablet Program are to enhance the overall well-being and quality of life for seniors, disabled adults, and children in the Florida's Senate District 30. The program seeks to achieve this by providing a specialized tablet with features tailored to address the unique needs of these demographics.
