This all-encompassing initiative aims to repurpose a former golf course with contaminated soil into a community asset by integrating essential infrastructure. As part of the broader benefit of Miami Freedom Park, it will not only foster recreation and economic growth but also function as a pivotal hub for global innovation in Miami and the home of Inter Miami Soccer Facility.
