1. **Project Title** Faulk Center for Counseling: expansion of mental health services for low-income families

4. **Project/Program Description**

For over 50 years, the Faulk Center for Counseling has provided low-cost/no-cost mental health services to economically disadvantaged and uninsured individuals, families, and children in Palm Beach and Broward Counties. Serving over 1,600 clients annually, the Center utilizes doctoral interns and graduate students to deliver personalized counseling and mental health services. To meet growing demand and expansion of services, in light of a well-documented public mental health crisis and concurrent shortage of qualified mental health professionals, we seek funding to hire two full-time Registered Mental Health Interns (RMHIs) and a part-time Qualified Supervisor. These roles will increase our capacity to provide individual, couple, family, and group therapy, all supervised by licensed clinicians following American Psychological Association (APA) standards. With this support, we aim to extend free/reduced-cost counseling and mental health services to an additional 350+ uninsured clients.

Salary and Benefits	The Faulk Center will employ 2.0 FTE Registered Mental Health Interns (RMHIs) at a total cost of \$135,000, including salaries and benefits. These RMHIs will provide direct counseling and mental health services to underserved populations. Additionally, we will hire 0.75 FTE Qualified Supervisor at a cost of \$75,000. This investment ensures high-quality oversight of student clinicians who provide evidence based clinical services.	210,000

Consultants/Contracted Services/Study	The Faulk Center allocates \$15,000 for travel and supplies to support the RMHIs and Qualified Supervisor. This includes reimbursement for travel to partnering schools and senior facilities, as well as essential materials for counseling sessions. 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

For years now, Florida has been suffering from a well-documented mental health crisis and an alarming shortage of qualified mental health professionals. The APA has also found that economically disadvantaged populations suffer from poor mental health outcomes at much higher-levels due to inaccessibility of mental health care services, cultural stigma surrounding mental health care, and overall lack of awareness. With a primary focus on low-income children, adults, seniors, and families, the Faulk Center serves those with the highest need. We provide personalized treatment for a variety of mental health issues with the goal of improving the emotional, psychological, and social well-being of individuals, children, and families in our community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Clients who receive counseling services are provided a treatment plan based on their individual needs and approved therapies. Progress is measured based on improvements from baseline assessments of symptomatic and functional impacts, identified during the initial intake and early sessions. Issues being treated are often the result of many underlying and intertwined dynamics. Clinicians are aware of this and are trained to adjust their approach, strategies, and timeline for progress to match that of the issues being presented by the client.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Clients work one-on-one with a mental health clinician in a safe, caring, and confidential environment. Weekly group counseling and support groups provide opportunities to reduce isolation, receive peer support, and collectively heal. Services to vulnerable populations, including uninsured and economically disadvantaged individuals, families, and children, are targeted through on site programs. Regular education and outreach events supplement the care of those who utilize our services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for counseling services is economically disadvantaged, uninsured, and/or underinsured clients in need of mental health services who reside in Palm Beach County and/or Broward County. The Faulk Center provides mental health and counseling services to over 1,600 individuals, families, and children each year. If funded, this project will allow us to further expand our capacity to serve an additional 350+ new clients in need.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Progress is measured by the reduction or leveling off of symptomatic impacts and increases in self-esteem, self-worth and/or functional improvements such as better self-care, control of negative/disrupting behaviors, or increased engagement in community, home, school and/or work life, as measured by clinical notes, clinical observation and client feedback.
