Pasco, Hernando and Miami-Dade who do not have custody of their children, are unemployed or underemployed and are having difficulty meeting their child support obligations, to establish a pattern of child support payments by obtaining and maintaining unsubsidized, competitive employment, to be better parents and help them become self-sufficient.
