a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Total State Funds Requested (must equal total from question #6)

The requested \$1M in state appropriations will be used to strengthen the local small business economy by addressing four critical areas vital to economic stability and growth. First, the initiative will focus on small business retention by reducing failures through targeted support, such as technical assistance and access to resources. Second, it will drive new business development by fostering entrepreneurship, encouraging innovation, and providing tools to overcome barriers to entry. Third, the funds will support job creation and retention, enabling businesses to expand operations and sustain employment opportunities.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

To meet the intended purpose of these funds, activities and services will focus on providing targeted support for small business retention, new business development, job creation, and workforce development. These efforts will include technical assistance, mentoring, and resource access for existing businesses; entrepreneurship training and incentives for startups; strategic growth support to create and sustain jobs; and skill-building programs to prepare the workforce for high-demand roles. Collaboration with stakeholders—including local agencies, chambers of commerce, educational institutions, financial institutions, large corporations, and small businesses.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation project will provide direct services to citizens that include workforce training programs to equip individuals with in-demand skills for employment, mentoring and entrepreneurial training for aspiring business owners, and access to resources such as grants, low-interest loans, and technical assistance for small business development. Additionally, citizens will benefit from job creation initiatives that offer new employment opportunities and support for existing positions, as well as programs designed to foster economic mobility by connecting individuals to career pathways and business growth opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project includes small business owners, aspiring entrepreneurs, job seekers, and the local workforce. The initiative focuses on supporting underserved and underrepresented groups, including minorities, women, and nontraditional workers, to promote equitable economic growth. It is expected to directly serve approximately 500 individuals, including small business owners and their employees, entrepreneurs launching new ventures, and citizens participating in workforce training programs, with an extended impact on the broader community through job creation and economic development.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is a strengthened local economy through increased small business stability, job creation, and workforce development. Key outcomes include reduced business failure rates, the launch of new businesses, the creation and retention of jobs, and improved workforce readiness in high-demand sectors. The methodology for measuring these outcomes will involve tracking the number of businesses supported, jobs created or retained, and individuals who complete workforce training programs. Success will be evaluated through both quantitative metrics (e.g., business survival rates, job placement rates, and training completion).

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables or performance measures will result in progressive financial withholding, such as 10% reduction of allocated funds for delays exceeding 60 days until compliance is achieved. The submission of a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within 30 days of underperformance, detailing the reasons and steps to rectify issues. Failure to implement the CAP within the agreed timeline will result in the potential for suspension of funding.
