	Focused initiative to	combat rising public health concerns linked to marijuana use. This program address

ses two critical areas: the effects of marijuana use during pregnancy and the risks of high-potency marijuana on youth mental health. DFAF will build on its successful marketing campaign and develop culturally sensitive, research-based educational materials for pregnant women, new mothers, and youth. These resources will be distributed in both print and digital formats to empower informed decision-making. Social media will play a vital role in engaging youth, while an existing online training course will be promoted to professionals. DFAF will also lead a photo-voice project involving mothers and mothers-to-be, promoting drug-free families. This project will strengthen existing partnerships and expand collaborations with healthcare facilities and medical organizations.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The requested funds will help DFAF achieve its goal of raising awareness about marijuana use. Specific purposes include creating educational materials for pregnant women, new mothers, and youth, and expanding outreach efforts. This aims to empower individuals with information to make informed decisions and reduce risks associated with marijuana use, strengthening partnerships and serving as a valuable resource for drug-related issues.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Educational material development and dissemination, on line resource creation and management, cross platform digital social media campaign utilization, promotion of training course for professional development in the field, photo-voice project, task force maintenance and youth advisory board engagement. These activities and services collectively aim to enhance public health awareness and mitigate the risks associated with marijuana use among target populations.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Education and awareness directed at pregnant and postpartum women and youth in the state of Florida. Professional development for individuals working in the field of drug demand reduction.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Pregnant and postpartum women and youth in the state of Florida as well as professionals working with those populations.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Overall attention and reach of the campaign will be measured by website visits and by social media impressions and clicks, via Google Analytics. DFAF will measure the number of new visitors, returning visitors, unique user sessions and page views to the campaign web page. Engagement will be measured through social media exposure resource downloads, and partner surveys.
