The goal of the requested funds is to enhance housing stability and safety for essential workers, seniors, and veterans. The funding will support the construction of new homes, rehabilitation of existing homes, and critical home repair projects, ensuring safe, affordable, and resilient housing for these priority populations.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

To fulfill the purpose of the \$700,000 appropriation, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Palm Beach County will carry out targeted home construction and repair projects, focusing on essential workers, seniors, and veterans. Additionally, we will provide homeownership and financial literacy training to help homeowners successfully manage and maintain their homes.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation will directly fund the construction, rehabilitation, and critical repair of homes, prioritizing essential workers, seniors, and veterans in Palm Beach County. Eligible individuals will gain access to safe, affordable housing, fostering long-term stability and self-sufficiency. Additionally, homeowners will receive guidance on home maintenance and financial responsibility. Through these efforts, we aim to strengthen the community by ensuring those who serve and sustain it have secure and resilient housing.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project's target population includes essential workers, seniors, and veterans within Greater Palm Beach County. Additionally, we are committed to assisting families earning below 80% of the area median income, as defined by HUD. Through this initiative, we expect to support approximately 19-20 households, benefiting around 45 individuals, helping to address critical housing needs across income levels in our community.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of this project is to increase access to safe, affordable housing and preserve existing homes for essential workers, seniors, veterans, and families earning below 80% of the area median income in Palm Beach County. This will contribute to a stronger, more stable community by ensuring housing security for those who sustain and serve it. To measure the project's impact, we will track the number of homes constructed, rehabilitated, and repaired, as well as the demographics of the households served. Additionally, periodic homeowner surveys will assess satisfaction, long-term stability, and overall community integration, providing a comprehensive evaluation of the project's success.
