#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The mission of the All Star Children's Foundation (ASCF) is to build a brighter future for children in foster care through innovation, science, and compassion. ASCF is situated on a 5-acre campus that includes a pediatric outpatient mental health treatment and research center, along with 6 single-family foster homes. Foster parents and children on living on campus and those enrolled in our outpatient program, receive comprehensive supportive services and assessments from a team of trauma-informed professionals. We provide foster care placements for children in our circuit, as well as expanding access to quality, evidence-based services and supports that address trauma for children and families in the community. We provide training on trauma for community agencies and providers working with children with histories of trauma.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funds will be used to implement trauma-based services and include: an assessment, consultation, counseling, and wrap-around supports for children in foster care and their caregivers living in the community. We also holding regular Multidisciplinary Team Meetings for each child residing on the ASCF campus and children in the community receiving outpatient mental health services. Additionally, we conduct training in evidence-based, trauma-informed care practices to community members and/or child welfare professionals.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services include evidence-based clinical therapy for children in foster care and their caregivers, developmental therapies (e.g., speech and occupational therapies), psychological and trauma assessments, case management, case consultation, linkage to services, and training for community members and providers (e.g., schools, Guardian ad Litem volunteers, case managers, clinicians, etc.) on trauma and trauma-informed care.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our target population for services and supports is children and families with child welfare involvement in the 12th judicial circuit, including licensed foster parents, relative caregivers, and birth families and their children. Training and consultation services are provided to various systems and professionals that intersect with children with trauma histories and child welfare involvement, including case managers, teachers, foster parents, mental health clinicians, Guardian ad Litem (GAL) volunteers, and court officials. We aim to serve 250-300 individuals during this funding cycle.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit to children in foster care would include early identification of developmental and mental health needs of children, reduced trauma symptoms, improved emotional and behavioral functioning, and improved social skills. Outcomes are measured through a battery of caregiver and child-report forms administered quarterly. This battery include: standardized measures that assess children's overall mental health and well-being, trauma symptoms, psychological functioning, social skills, and adaptive skills. Benefits to foster parents working with ASCF include, improved trauma-informed parenting techniques, overall well-being, as well as retention and recruitment of foster parents into the circuit.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Failing to meet deliverables could include implementing a corrective action plan to ensure deliverables and performance measures are met. Additionally, if agency fails to successfully complete the corrective action plan, funding would be discontinued.
