a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Classroom education for state of Florida law enforcement officers to develop "soft skills" required to address unprecedented levels of stress and anxiety in performing daily duties. Officers are under-equipped to recognize and deal with these social and emotional strains and this education fills a needed gap.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Classroom education with an approved and accredited curriculum focused on emotional health, suicide awareness, and financial literacy.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

United States Law Enforcement Foundation's Visitor Experience will provide the opportunity for the public to become educated about the law enforcement profession and hear stories about the humanity of the men and women who "protect and serve" their communities. The immersive experience will inspire citizens via world class story telling brought to life by best in class production technology while also inspiring young visitors to consider a career in law enforcement.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Current and retired law enforcement and all those involved in it, the general public (specifically in regards to the immersive visitor experience), and school students through age appropriate law enforcement career exploration programming. Third party studies indicate that over 250,000 will be served by year three of the initiative.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Direct benefits to Florida's law enforcement officers will be measure via post education surveys that measure self-reported value in each of the skill areas being developed as well as formal personal follow-up by educators to command staff of those in United States Law Enforcement Foundation classes and programs. A one year anniversary follow-up will also be utilized.
