### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funding will allow the Boys & Girls Clubs of Martin County to launch workforce programs to include Manufacturing 4.0, CDW eSports, and Miller Electric's AugmentedArc welding training system. These comprehensive, industry-focused training programs will provide advanced skills training and certification for a minimum of 250 workforce-ready teens and young adults in year 1 & a minimum of 100 program graduates yearly in subsequent years.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The funded programs will develop youth for career pathways starting in 8th grade and continuing through high school and beyond. High school graduation will be positioned as a launch pad, rather than a destination. All BGCMC programs are offered at no charge to youth and their families.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funded programs will provide multi-dimensional hands on and eLearning courses that lead to certification in some of industry's highest-demand professions to any eligible citizens of Martin County.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The majority of the funds requested will serve Jobless Persons, Economically Disadvantaged Persons, Middle and High School Students, University/College Students. The project will serve a minimum of 250 individuals in year one and at least 100 individuals in subsequent years.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

75% of the students who enroll in the Programs will gain technical and employability skills that will lead to certification in Manufacturing 4.0, CDW eSports, and Miller Electric's AugmentedArc welding training system. All participants will be registered and entered into an online database. Progress and results will be tracked and the data will be analyzed and reported by an independent, 3rd party evaluator. Participants will also participate in pre and post surveys to assess program efficacy.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables would result in financial consequences including withholding of funding or reduction in specified payments.
