a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The requested funds will enable the Town of Bronson to build its first community center, providing a dedicated space for public gatherings, meetings, and emergency sheltering. The Bronson Community & Resilience Center will enhance community engagement, disaster preparedness, and local services, ensuring residents have a safe, accessible facility for civic, social, and emergency needs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Bronson Community & Resilience Center will host public meetings, community events, educational programs, and emergency sheltering. It will provide multi-purpose spaces for civic engagement, recreation, and disaster response coordination. The facility will support training sessions, workshops, and social services, ensuring a safe, accessible hub for residents and local organizations.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Bronson Community & Resilience Center will provide public meeting space, emergency sheltering, recreational activities, and community programs. Citizens will have access to educational workshops, disaster response coordination, training sessions, and social services. The center will serve as a safe, accessible hub for civic engagement, local events, and emergency preparedness efforts.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Bronson Community & Resilience Center will serve Bronson residents, local businesses, and visitors, providing a space for community events, meetings, and emergency sheltering. The project is expected to benefit approximately 1,100 residents in Bronson and support the broader Levy County population of over 42,000 during regional emergencies and disaster response efforts.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Bronson Community & Resilience Center will enhance community engagement, public safety, and disaster preparedness by providing a dedicated space for events, meetings, and emergency sheltering. Outcomes will be measured through facility usage rates, event participation, emergency shelter capacity, and community feedback, ensuring the center meets the town's civic and emergency needs.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Suggested penalties include financial withholdings for missed deadlines, liquidated damages for delays, and contract termination for repeated non-compliance. The agency may also require corrective action plans, impose additional reporting requirements, or restrict the contractor's eligibility for future projects to ensure accountability and the successful completion of the Bronson Community & Resilience Center.
