### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Excellence in STEAM Program seeks to build the aforementioned hard and soft skill proficiencies, including coding, building and engineering robots, and prototyping, while also building effective communication and project management skills in a research format. The goal is to provide these underserved students with the materials they need to build these skills and knowledge bases for the benefit of the community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Challenging students to engage in expeditionary and immersive learning through a STEAM+ lens while investigating real-world and global STEAM+ challenges. Ensuring that students receive academically aligned STEAM+ experiences and instruction while enhancing their abilities to collaborate, engage in critical thinking, communicate proficiently, and employ creativity to solve problems.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

In addition to the in-class program, the program integrates field trips and immersion activities, such as a trip to the Everglades to learn about Environmental Engineering, field trips to the public library to learn effective research methodologies, a trip to NASA's Kennedy Space Center for the middle school to learn about space exploration, and visits by guest speakers from different ethnicities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, and preschool/grade school students. We expect to serve 50-100 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Gains and improvements in Reading and Comprehension: 75% of the participants will gain an increased knowledge on reading and comprehension. Study Island: Specific tracking of the outcomes and indicators included log-ins, study island grid rosters and report cards of which contained a combination of assessments, scores and student progress via: Pre-Tests and Post-Tests, evaluations, test scores, test score gains, student progress reports.
