Providing safe transportation, we ensure a safe and secure process for students to arrive and depart from school. This process will enable students and families to have a more effective and focused educational experience in school. Providing transportation will also alleviate traffic and secure the soft target of carpool lanes. We will have periodic assessments and require school administrators to provide reports. We will also have random site visits.
