13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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We will utilize the funding to create a training program for state and local law enforcement, as well as stand up former JSOC intelligence analysts utilizing intelligence targeting techniques to find missing children and bring them to safety. We will staff these analysts directly within Homeland Security Fusion Centers, which we have already coordinated with HSI about and have green light. The training program with law enforcement will help train them on advanced analytical practices and create a bridge for law enforcement to work with HSI on solving this problem. There is currently no group or organization focused on this problem.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Direct training of state and local law enforcement on advanced tactics, techniques, and procedures for human targeting analysis. These TTPs are directly sourced from the war on terror and are extremely effective at finding missing children. We will also staff former JSOC Intelligence analysts directly in HSS Fusion Centers to coordinate and find these missing children in real time, while also traveling through the state of Florida to train law enforcement on these TTPs to increase the capability of all working on this problem set

	Finding their missing kids in a timely manner, and bringing them back to safety.					
	d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?					
	All citizens of Florida.					
	e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?					
	We believe we can exponentially decrease the number of resources spent on finding missing children when they go missing. Law Enforcement currently uses very old TTPs to find kids when they go missing, such as a dragnet and wide area search. Both of which are very resource costly, ineffective, and time intensive. We don't need 100 cops and a helicopter searching 200 square miles to find a kid for 7 days to find a missing kid; we need only a few analysts with laptops, and we have a proven method that works quickly. We will directly quantify the number of kids rescued on a per capita basis in multiple AORs based on the HSI Fusion Center locations. We will also quantify how many children law enforcement is able to help directly before and after the training we will provide them. Again, we believe this to be exponential benefit at first.
