To enhance the City of Fort Lauderdale's Education Enrichment Program, which supports over 1,500 low-income youth annually by addressing learning gaps, improving academic performance, and promoting workforce readiness. The program will continue expanding after-school and summer educational/workforce initiatives, offering workshops, paid internships, and mentorships. Building on proven success, this funding will help equip participants with essential skills for academic, professional, and civic success.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will support after-school and summer programs offering academic enrichment, tutoring, career readiness workshops, paid internships, and mentorship opportunities with City departments and community partners. These activities aim to close learning gaps, enhance workforce skills, and promote civic engagement among low-income youth.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation will provide direct services including academic tutoring, after-school and summer enrichment programs, career readiness workshops, paid internships for high school students, and mentorship opportunities with City departments and community partners to support low-income youth in achieving academic, professional, and civic success.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project is low-income children and youth aged 5 to 18. The program is expected to serve over 1,500 individuals annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits of this project include improved academic performance in reading and math, enhanced workforce readiness, and increased civic engagement among low-income youth. Outcomes will be measured using pre- and post-program assessments for academic skills, participation rates in career readiness activities, and feedback from participants and mentors.
