#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

In collaboration with CodeBoxx Academy and other community-focused institutions, the CodeBoxx Foundation addresses Tampa Bay's pressing need for skilled tech talent. CodeBoxx's accelerated training programs give participants hands-on experience with in-demand technology tools, programming languages, and industry practices. Graduates leave the program equipped with the tools necessary to meet the workforce demands of the region's top startups and established businesses and with access to transformative career pathways and economic mobility.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

CodeBoxx will provide 8-10 boot camps with cohorts of 20-25 participants each, leading to immediate employment and long-term financial security for over 200 +/- Tampa residents (85% of CodeBoxx graduates who have completed the program have been placed in jobs immediately upon graduation at partner companies such as eBay, Humana, Spontivly Bedrock, iDimension, RevStar, and even CodeBoxx).

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

200+ individuals will be equipped to enter the technology workforce supported by essential wrap-around services including career training, job placement, ongoing mentor support and case management, ensuring comprehensive support throughout their training.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This initiative is designed to prioritize candidates with the potential for success in the tech industry but face various obstacles in upskilling. These individuals often need more resources and support systems to access pathways leading to higher-paying jobs. The program aims to bridge this gap by providing the right support and assistance to help them overcome these challenges and seize the opportunities available. Over 200 individuals are expected to be trained to enter the workforce through this project. Expected to host 8-10 boot camps with cohorts of 20-25 Tampa Bay residents each and a specialized tech training cohort focused on South St. Petersburg, addressing local community needs with an expected 15-20 students in the cohort.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

CodeBoxx anticipates that state funding would provide immediate employment leading to long-term financial security for over 200+ Tampa Bay residents. This outcome will be measured through employment placement of students. To date, over 250 CodeBoxx graduates have completed the program, with 85% placed in jobs immediately upon graduation at partner companies such as eBay, Humana, Spontivly Bedrock, iDimension, RevStar, and even CodeBoxx itself.
