This request aims to support the BHH Job Training Program and its operating costs. The program aims to assist 160 individuals in completing a job certification program and becoming employed after graduating.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The JTP pays for vocational training for low income individuals that need to up-skill in order to earn a higher wage to become self sufficient. Following graduation/achievement of certification, JTP students participate in BHH's one-on-one Job Mentoring Program, where volunteers with workplace experience assist graduates with resume writing, cover letter development, and job searching.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

After being accepted into a Job Training Program, each participant must first complete our week long Personal & Professional Skills Development training course, held over five days. The course includes professional development and
