### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The mission of North Port Utilities is to provide our customers quality water and sewer services in a safe, healthful, cost-effective, and efficient manner and to accommodate the growth of our community through planned expansions of our system. Because of explosive growth outside of the current sewer service area, many homes have septic tanks on small lots. This can cause contamination of surface waters and ground water with disease-causing pathogens and nitrates. Other problems include excessive nitrogen discharges and phosphorus pollution of inland surface waters, which increases algal growth and lowers dissolved oxygen levels. Expansion of our current sewer system will mitigate these issues.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The construction of a vacuum station and installation and extension of vacuum mains to approximately 200 properties in the City of North Port. Also, this project includes the connection of the properties to the system and removal of existing septic tanks on affected properties.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Successful completion of this project will provide City water and sewer connections for approximately 200 properties in the City of North Port. This project will also remove septic tanks from said properties, reducing health risks to residents as a result of leaking or failing septic systems.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project is residents in the Blue Ridge / Salford neighborhood. Approximately 200 properties in this neighborhood are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will benefit residents who live in the Blue Ridge / Salford neighborhood and the surrounding natural environment. This project will remove on-site nutrients, including nitrates, and disease-causing pathogens that can be found in septic systems. Monitoring of groundwater and surface water is the methodology in which this outcome will be measured.
