13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose to be achieved is to protect Florida retailers and retail customers from the violence and financial costs that result from organized retail crime (ORC). The goal is to provide the Office of the Attorney General and law enforcement agencies throughout the state, the tools needed to successfully prevent, combat and prosecute ORC cases.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The funds will be utilized to contract with a third-party vendor to host an intelligence sharing platform in support of the Florida Organized Retail Crime Exchange (FORCE). This platform is currently being utilized by 383 retail users and 641 law enforcement users. The purpose of the program is to support a public/private partnership (FORCE) to exchange intelligence in the fight against organized retail crime (ORC). The goal is to continue to identify ORC offenders and trends, and successfully prosecute cross-jurisdictional cases of ORC.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Services will directly support citizens working in law enforcement and retail asset protection, and help ensure the safety of Florida's retail employees, costumers and stores.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The FORCE intelligence platform is currently utilized by retailers, state and local law enforcement agencies, local prosecutors and the Office of the Attorney General. Currently, users include over 383 retail users representing 120 retail companies and 641 law enforcement users representing 125 agencies.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

We expect the project to promote increased collaboration and intelligence sharing between law enforcement agencies and private retail establishments resulting in decreased retail theft and successful prosecution of cross-jurisdictional organized retail crime cases. The outcome will be measured by monitoring of data sharing analytics and documentation of successful case prosecutions that are facilitated or assisted by use of the platform.
