13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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This project will reduce nitrogen pollution to the Indian River Lagoon by over 7,942 pounds per year by providing sewer service to 295 properties on septic systems in Brevard County. This will reduce the amount of nutrient and human waste reaching the groundwater and migrating to the Indian River Lagoon and lead to improved water quality, environmental health, recreation and property values.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Plumbing contractors will decommission the private septic systems and connect those properties to sanitary sewer.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Brevard County will provide funds for qualified plumbing and septic contractors to abandon septic systems and connect private properties to sanitary sewer. Funds will cover the costs associated with abandonment of deactivated septic systems and installation and connection of new sanitary sewer equipment.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is households on septic who are contributing the greatest amount of nutrient pollution to the Indian River Lagoon, due to proximity of the septic systems to the lagoon, rapid conductivity of porous sandy soils, shallow depth to groundwater and other factors that convey pollution. In addition to the targeted households served directly, improved water quality in the Indian River Lagoon will benefit marine life, recreation, tourism and over 600,000 residents of Brevard.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Nitrogen pollution to the Indian River Lagoon will be reduced by over 7,942 lbs per year by providing sewer service to 295 properties. Monitoring data from the BreezeSwept project in Rockledge documented significant and swift nutrient and bacterial reduction following conversion from septic to sewer.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

In addition to not getting reimbursed for any unmet deliverables, Legislators will take past performance into account when considering sponsorship of future Legislative requests for this type of project.
