The specific purpose to be achieved by this funding request is to alleviate flooding that occurs within the Sandpipes neighborhood, Palm Colony Club Condominium complex, along Atlantic Avenue, and along Coral Way in Brevard's Stormwater District 4 Indialantic Region. The project will also improve water quality in the Indian River Lagoon by improving stormwater resiliency in the area.

-	The proposed improvements will alleviate flooding issues in neighborhoods within the Indialantic region.

n	The target population are the residents of the area around the identified areas of flooding including the Sandpipes neighborhood, along Atlantic Avenue, and along Coral Way. Approximately 5000 individuals will be served by the proposed improvements.
	. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will e measured?
a c	The expected benefit or outcome of the project is the replacement and/or upgrades the drainage systems to reach an acceptable level of service for flood control throughout the project area. The outcome will be measured during rainy conditions in the area to determine whether the improvements alleviated flooding by allowing the runoff to flow to the hree (3) existing outfalls.
