Phase 2 funds are being requested for construction consisting of upgrades to the drainage system along Riverside Drive, including upgrades to the existing trunkline with an extension toward Coral Way. The Phase 2 project also includes relocating and de-conflicting gravity and force main sewer utilities. Phase 1 (A&B) was funded by Brevard County and is under construction. The overall project is subdivided into logical phases of construction. The project is (9) nine phases and is estimated at approximately \$22M.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose to be achieved by this funding request is to alleviate flooding that occurs within the Sandpipes neighborhood, Palm Colony Club Condominium complex, along Atlantic Avenue, and along Coral Way in Brevard's Stormwater District 4 Indianalantic Region. The project will also improve water quality in the Indian River Lagoon by improving stormwater resiliency in the area.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Proposed improvements include the following:

- Dredging existing canal
- Upsizing pipes
- Lining existing corrugated metal pipes
- Adding additional ditch bottom inlets, curb inlets, and stormwater pipes
- Replacing drainage structures in poor condition

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The proposed improvements will alleviate flooding issues in neighborhoods within the Indialantic region.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are the residents of the area around the identified areas of flooding including the Sandpipes neighborhood, along Atlantic Avenue, and along Coral Way. Approximately 5000 individuals will be served by the proposed improvements.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit or outcome of the project is the replacement and/or upgrades the drainage systems to reach an acceptable level of service for flood control throughout the project area. The outcome will be measured during rainy conditions in the area to determine whether the improvements alleviated flooding by allowing the runoff to flow to the three (3) existing outfalls.

The County's contracts for construction include comprehensive provisions that address failure to perform, including liquidated damages for not achieving Substantial Completion, and termination. In addition, the County will complete a post-construction evaluation of the contractor and submit the form to the County's Purchasing Services.
