#### 4. Project/Program Description

Design and build an extension of approximately 16,100 sq ft to the existing Adoption Center. This extension would house a low-cost public veterinary clinic, surgery center and public humane education center. This design would create cohesion between existing buildings and help to meet the continued demand for services from the public and future growth of the department. This project will provide PCAS the ability to perform thousands of additional spay/neuter surgeries, preventative care vaccinations, tests, and procedures for citizen's pets annually, including veterinary care for homeless and under-served communities. In a recent citizen survey, it was noted approximately 48% of citizens in Pasco County do not have access to affordable veterinary care or simply cannot afford available veterinary care.

## 13. Program Performance

## a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose is to build a public clinic at the Animal Services facility to offer affordable veterinary vaccinations and spay/neuter services to the public. These services continue to be the highest need in the county for pet welfare among the elderly, veterans, and other demographics. The clinic will also house the administrative offices for the Animal Services Department as well as offer an education center for humane education.

## b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



Provide affordable services for pet sterilization, vaccinations, testing, certain veterinary products to prevent common disease, parasite prevention, and treatment for Heartworm, zoonotic diseases including rabies prevention; and provide sterilization and vaccination services for the growing community cats populations in the area.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Animal Services facility will offer affordable veterinary vaccinations and spay/neuter services to the public. These services continue to be the highest need in the county for pet welfare among the elderly, veterans, and other demographics.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served would be the pet-owning public in the region. Individuals to be served would range between 10,000-15,000K annually.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of the project and services to be provided is to improve the health and well-being of people and pets in the community and reduce the threat of rabies. The methodology used to measure would be community surveys to determine quality of service as well as the need, afford-ability and availability of services provided; and the measure of vaccinations provided and compliance ratio of pet owning households.
