Early warning cancer detection tests for veterans that have been exposed to burn pits and toxins. The Galleri test can detect over 50 different types of cancer at stage 1 or stage 2.

The Florida Senate **Local Funding Initiative Request Fiscal Year 2025-2026**

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We provide the marketing and advertising of our cancer program in order to identify and recruit Florida veterans that have been exposed to burn pits and toxins. We verify the veteran's status, register the veteran for the Galleri blood test and pay for the Galleri early warning cancer detection test. We track the results of each test, help the veteran receive any needed cancer treatment and will provide the results in a study to be presented to the VA.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Galleri early warning cancer detection tests will be given to Florida veterans that have been exposed to burn pits and toxins. These funds will provide 1,400 tests. Combined with the current in place funding for 452 tests, over 1850 Florida veterans will be tested for free. We help the Florida veteran receive needed cancer treatment.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida Veterans that have been exposed to burn pits and toxins are the target population. We have received a Marion County Community Development Block Grant of \$50,000 and a Marion County Hospital District Grant of \$300,000. The Grail Corporation will provide an in-kind donation of over \$1,000,000. We initiated our program Jan 6, 2025 and have given the test to over 50 Florida veterans as of Feb 12, 2025. Another 400 Florida veterans will be tested this year using the current grants for a total of over 1,850 tests.

A total of over 1,850 Florida Veterans will receive the Galleri early warning cancer detection test for free.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Florida veterans learning that they have no indications of cancer or catching cancer at early stages will ease the strain on their physical and mental health. They have been trying to deal with not knowing when they will be hit with the ravages of cancer from their exposure to burn pits and toxins during their service to our country.

The early warning cancer detection testing improves the veteran's economic self sufficiency and improves the use of Florida medical facilities because treating advanced cancer requires the use of many times more medical resources than the treatment provided when a cancer is detected early.

We will track the results of each Galleri early warning cancer detection test and will provide the results in a study to be presented to the VA.
