a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funds will help offset the total cost of Phase 1 of the project which is \$22.3 million. The project is needed to replace a 36-inch gravity pipeline that is experiencing material failures and has reached its hydraulic capacity.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Procurement and installation of manholes and gravity sewer main

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?



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Improved reliability of wastewater services through upgraded construction and added capacity of the Western Trunk Gravity Sewer project.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The citizens and businesses within the Western Trunk Main project area of Lakeland will be served by the project. The Western Trunk Gravity Sewer Project is expected to serve >15,900 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The existing pipeline has reached hydraulic capacity thereby preventing new customer connections including new potential industrial or commercial establishments in the west Lakeland area. Adding capacity will increase the potential of new industrial or commercial customers to connect. The flows from proposed industrial/commercial customers can be quantified in gallons per day. Some industrial/commercial customers may have larger flow demands but will likely contribute more to the local economy in the way of jobs.
