13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of these projects is the reduction nitrogen and phosphorus discharges to the Indian River Lagoon (IRL), reduction in flooding of existing residential areas of the City, and increase in pedestrian safety along roadways connecting residential areas to beach accesses and commercial businesses.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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These improvements include the narrowing of roadways to reduce the impervious area and to reduce stormwater runoff. Improvements also include the construction of stormwater collection and conveyance features to direct the runoff to BAM filter systems and collection baskets to remove suspended solids, nitrogen, and phosphorus prior to being discharged into the IRL. There will also be a reduction of flooding in existing residential areas of the City, and increase in pedestrian safety along roadways connecting residential areas to beach accesses and commercial businesses.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services that will be provided to citizens are improved water quality in the Indian River lagoon for all stakeholders in the community to enjoy as well as increased pedestrian safety.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project are the citizens of Satellite Beach, our neighboring municipalities, Patrick Space Force Base, and unincorporated Brevard County. The estimated population of Brevard County in 2023 was 643,979 according to the US census bureau.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

These projects will remove nutrients, debris, trash, and their associated pollutants from stormwater that runs off into the Indian River Lagoon. Nutrient reduction will enhance habitats within the Indian River Lagoon and promote the growth of critical seagrasses and other keystone species. In conjunction with the roadway and stormwater improvements, sidewalks will be constructed to provide safe pedestrian ways which are currently non-existent with pedestrians having to share the vehicle travel lanes. These outcomes will be measured by the observation of improved water quality in the IRL and observation of improved pedestrian safety.

Should the City of Satellite Beach not utilize the funding allocated by the State of Florida to fund and meet the deliverables of the project, the City of Satellite Beach will be required to return the funding to the State of Florida.
