The project involves the acquisition and demolition of four homes to construct a stormwater pond with pump station to help keep water out of the remaining homes on Green Street and Brian Avenue. The homes located on these two streets flooded during Hurricane Ian, Nicole and now Milton. The existing stormwater system is tied into a nearby canal and when it is full, water just accumulates on these streets eventually getting into the homes. The introduction of a pond will store the collected stormwater thus keeping it out nearby homes.

A stormwater impoundment area needs to be created so that stormwater can be stored until the drainage canal allows inflow again, in order to create a more resilient area for future storms.

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This project calls for the acquisition and demolition of four homes between Green Street and Brian Avenue and constructing a stormwater pond with pump station to keep water out of homes in this area.

Creating a more resilient area which will keep water from infiltrating homes during heavy rain events.

186 homes, with approximately 570 individuals.

The expected benefit from the completion of this project is the reduction of residential flooding on these two streets. The methodology used to determine the benefit of this project will be based on the pond's capacity to collect stormwater which would otherwise be in the street and homes in this area.
