### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Walk Off Charities is a Jacksonville based non profit with a mission to provide opportunities, resources, and access to the game of baseball and softball for any youth that desires to learn or play. Through various programs, events, and activities we aim to give under-served youth opportunities they may not have had otherwise. With increasingly growing programs and needs, the purpose of requesting these funds is to allow us to expand our reach across northeast Florida to impact even more youth.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Youth baseball/softball programs including: 1) Clinics in partnerships with Title I Elementary Schools, 2) Camps for children during winter/summer break, 3) Leagues for youth to participate in a team sport, learning life-skills 4) Events for community wide engagement and support 5) Training & Exposure for serious student-athletes, 6) Field Refurbishment & Maintenance for parks in need.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A mix of direct services will be provided through this funding request and include: after school programming (Leagues and related activities include practices, games, and special events), physical education / special education (clinics engage youth during school hours, teaching them a new sport and skills related to that sport), park cleanup/revitalization for participating programs parks.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The program will serve over 800 students from preschool through college aged with mental and physical health needs and those residing in some of our most economically disadvantaged areas of Northeast Florida.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

One of the main benefits of this project is the improvement of both the mental and physical well-being of those participants. Additionally, this program provides increased exposure to diverse cultural experiences through sporting activities. This will be measured in a variety of ways including pre and post program surveys as well as different motor skills assessment testing. This program also provides job opportunities within the local community that it serves as well as internship positions. By providing an opportunity for our youth to connect with mentors and coaches, this program serves as a diversion from criminal activity for those participants. This will be measured through local crime statistics and community surveys.
