### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Effective diversion and intervention for at-risk youth which includes redirection through community service events and mentoring and tutoring sessions to help prevent juvenile delinquency. Nassau County will contract directly with a program director to provide mentoring and tutoring services. The Nassau County Sheriff's Office will administer the community service events.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This program will provide mentoring and tutoring services as well as supervised community service events for at-risk and probation youth.



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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This program is designed to provide a graduated system of community service hours as well as mentoring and tutoring services for at-risk and probation youth to help in preventing juvenile delinquency.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

At-risk youth between the ages of six (6) and eighteen (18). Approximately 51-100 youth.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This program is designed to help improve or build self-esteem, life skills, character development, professional skills, peer-pressure, personal development and leadership skills in order to decrease future/repeat criminal behavior. The tutoring services offered will aid in preventing truancy and assist with academic achievement. Progression of the program services can be tracked along with the number of participants that successfully complete the program. On-going assessments of behavior can also be conducted and tracked. This data can be used to determine the Program's overall success and to generate monthly reports for each participant to determine whether truancy has been reduced and academic issues improved through the use of tutoring and mentoring.
