This project will include resurfacing roadways, installing raised medians, adding bike lanes from Atlantic Blvd to Trednick Parkway, installing dual eastbound left-turn lanes and northbound receiving lanes at St. Johns Bluff Road, constructing 1.1 miles of new sidewalk on Monument Road from Regency Square Blvd North to Lee Road and 900 feet of sidewalk from Atlantic Blvd to Monument Road, and reconfiguring the lane assignments at Trednick Parkway. This work was recommended by a 2020 North Florida TPO Corridor Study.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project will include resurfacing roadways, installing raised medians, adding bike lanes from Atlantic Blvd to Trednick Parkway, installing dual eastbound left-turn lanes and northbound receiving lanes at St. Johns Bluff Road, constructing 1.1 miles of new sidewalk on Monument Road from Regency Square Blvd North to Lee Road and 900 feet of sidewalk from Atlantic Blvd to Monument Road, and reconfiguring the lane assignments at Trednick Parkway.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project will resurface lanes, install raised medians and bike lanes from Atlantic Blvd to Trednick Pkwy, install dual eastbound left-turn lanes and northbound receiving lanes at St. Johns Bluff Rd, construct 1.1 miles of new sidewalk on Monument Rd from Regency Square Blvd N to Lee Rd and 900 feet of sidewalk from Atlantic Blvd to Monument Rd, and reconfigure the lane assignments at Trednick.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will will reduce delay and improve safety along Monument Road and support other non-motor vehicle forms of transportation.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reconfiguring lanes to improve traffic flow can lead to fewer traffic jams and reduce the time people spend in vehicles. Resurfacing enhances road quality, reducing bumps and potholes, which can lead to fewer accidents and injuries. When roads are in better condition, drivers and cyclists are less likely to be involved in crashes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Collect traffic accident data from local law enforcement or city transportation departments to determine if the number and severity of accidents have decreased in the area since the project was completed. Look specifically for reductions in accidents involving pedestrians, cyclists, and cars at key intersections that were redesigned (e.g., at St. Johns Bluff Rd or Trednick).
