13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The addition of a turf field will significantly improve athletic opportunities for students while addressing limitations posed by our current field conditions. Unlike natural grass fields, which require frequent maintenance and are susceptible to weather-related closures, a turf field will provide a consistent, year-round playing surface. The proposed turf will feature advanced shock-absorption technology, reducing the risk of injuries while supporting a variety of sports and fitness activities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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This facility will be used for physical education classes, organized sports, and school-wide events, encouraging healthy lifestyles and teamwork among students.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The new field will not only benefit students but also serve as a valuable asset for local sports teams, youth programs, and community gatherings, fostering stronger civic engagement.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The primary beneficiaries of the Cornerstone Classical Academy Turf Field Project are the 1,092 enrolled students, who will gain access to a safe, high-quality athletic facility for physical education, sports, and recreational activities. Additionally, the field will serve faculty, staff, and families by fostering a more engaged and active school community. Beyond CCA, the wider community will benefit as the field is expected to host local youth sports leagues, community events, and extracurricular programs, further promoting health and wellness among children and families in the area.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The primary anticipated outcomes include increased student participation in athletics and physical activity, enhanced safety and injury prevention, greater utilization of athletic facilities, community engagement and increased access for local programs. To measure the project's impact, CCA will track student participation in sports, PE classes, and intramural activities, compare injury reports before and after installation, and monitor field usage through scheduling data. Additionally, surveys with coaches, students, parents with be conducted.
