a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used to purchase a Mobile Investigative Command Vehicle. The vehicle will significantly increase the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office capabilities when conducting investigations and responding to critical incidents by providing a versatile on-scene command center with advanced investigative resources and equipment.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funding will allow for a more rapid and complete response to emergencies in Duval County. The Mobile Investigative Command Vehicle will be deployed to serve as an on-scene command post during mass casualty events, officer involved shootings, search and rescue efforts, large scale disasters, mutual aid deployments, and other tactical or investigative operations.



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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Mobile Investigative Command Vehicle will allow the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office to rapidly deploy investigative equipment and personnel to critical incident scenes. This will allow for quicker assistance to victims and more thorough investigations, potentially saving lives.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Mobile Investigative Command Vehicle will serve the over the one million citizens of Duval County during critical incidents. Additionally, it will be utilized to support surround counties during mutual aid deployments.

The vehicle will dramatically enhance the agency's on-scene coordination and response times. Its success can be measured by the agency's improved efficiency when managing critical incidents and conducting investigations because of the additional resources and equipment available at the scene.
