13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose of the program will be to serve individuals within Florida's adult drop out population that are considered unemployed or underemployed. The intent of the program is to improve their employment and earning prospects by providing them with the opportunity to obtain high school and career credentials through the Florida Public Library System.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities & services provided will consist of the following: a customized portal, 92 semester courses (academic and career training), transcript analysis, academic coaches (certified teachers), learning management system, student services support, issuance of high school diplomas and career certificates.



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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services will be as follows: a customized portal, 92 semester courses (academic and career training), transcript analysis, academic coaches (certified teachers), learning management system, student services support, issuance of high school diplomas and career certificates.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

According to the US Census (2021), over 2.534 million Florida's adults age 25 and older lack a high school diploma or its equivalent. \$1,200,000 will provide approximately 926 scholarships for the State of Florida Library System to use in providing services to this population.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

In addition to the adult dropouts, the Florida taxpayers will benefit. The typical lifetime cost of each high school dropout to taxpayers is approximately \$292,000. A high school diploma and a career certificate opens up eligibility for matriculation into post-secondary education programs, and assists high school dropouts in joining the ranks of taxpaying citizens. Program performance is reported to the Florida Department of State and the Division of Library and Information Services on a monthly basis. This data includes the number of credits earned towards high school graduation by each student; the number of high school diplomas and career certificates awarded to students who complete the program.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The vendor's online program shall be available from 7 AM through 10 PM (EST), Monday through Friday. The program shall be available 95% of each month, as verified by an independent monitoring company and reported monthly. Financial consequences in the amount of \$5,000 will be imposed for each month that the vendor's program availability (as reported by the independent monitoring company) drops below 95%; and \$10,000 each month that availability drops below 90%.
