#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

As all states struggle to hire and retain qualified teachers, this appropriation will assist in this effort by providing prospective teaching candidates and in-place teachers who face new subject assignments, sustained professional development resources in 100 subject-specific courses.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The curriculum materials, that work with any assigned textbook, will include complete instructional support with suggested daily pacing guide, daily lesson plans, PowerPoint class notes, student activity book or lab manual and editable assessments with keys. The courses may, in addition, be approved to any school district Professional Learning Catalog (PLC, formerly the Master Inservice Program), to gain Inservice points toward license renewal and/or highly effective teacher designation.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Teachers enrolled in the program will first take a pre-test to determine subject understanding. Next, they will receive subject-specific curriculum materials relating to their new subject assignment. Next, after using the sustained professional development materials in class during the school year. Each set of subject-specific materials comprise of hundreds of pages of materials including complete PowerPoint class note color slides. Finally, they will take a post-test to determine subject knowledge improvement. During the school year, if their school district approves the subject to their Professional Learning Catalog, they will, if having passed the post-test, receive points toward license renewal.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

New teachers with out-of-field subject assignments or experienced teachers with new assignments (possibly out-of-field). 400 teachers may enroll in the program from any Florida School District.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Appropriations were approved previously on the 2015 (\$500,00) and 2016 (\$700,000) budgets enrolling a total of 775 teachers over the two years in which each enrolled teacher took a pre-test to determine subject knowledge. At the end of the school year, after using the material provided, a post-test was administered to determine improvement in subject knowledge. Only 27% of enrolled teachers passed the pre-test before being provided the sustained professional development subject-specific materials. At the end of the school years over 90% of enrolled passed the post-test providing empirical proof the program worked, and the Appropriation was justified. The same methodology will be used in the proposed Appropriation.

Regarding previous Appropriations, there were no penalties assigned in previous deliverables or performance measures, and we do not expect any in the future. That said, Standard penalties will be acceptable.
