The funds will support the replacement of an outdated stormwater drainage system and outfall, reducing flooding risks and improving water quality in Dania Beach.

The project will include installation of modern stormwater infrastructure, and restoration of impacted areas to ensure efficient drainage and environmental compliance.

The project will provide improved flood protection, better stormwater management, and enhanced resilience to heavy rainfall, benefiting public safety and property values.

The target population includes residents, businesses, schools, churches, law enforcement, and visitors in the impacted drainage area, with over 3,000 estimated individuals benefiting directly from reduced flooding and improved drainage.

The expected outcomes include reduced flooding incidents, enhanced water quality in the receiving water body, and increased community resilience. These will be measured through pre- and post-construction flooding data, water quality monitoring, and feedback from affected residents and businesses.
