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The goal is to expand marine career education in Florida by introducing interactive STEAM-based learning for Grades 1-6 through the Ocean Rangers program while providing middle and high school students with certified marine apprenticeships. The program offers hands-on experiences, soft skills training, and industry partnerships to prepare students for land and at-sea careers through updated resources, educator outreach, and digital engagement.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Students will embark on an ocean adventure with the Ocean Rangers exploring fun lessons and activities focused on ocean safety and cleanliness. Through STEAM and SEL materials, they'll learn about ships, build their own boat, and discover the importance of the Ocean Rangers in protecting our planet's waters and ecosystem health, all while demonstrating how STEAM translates into practical jobs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will provide Florida students with hands-on learning through the Ocean Rangers program, focusing on ocean safety, cleanliness, and ecosystem health. Students will explore ships, build boats, and learn STEAM and SEL concepts tied to real-world marine careers. These activities promote teamwork, problem-solving, and environmental stewardship, giving students valuable skills for the future.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

High School and Middle School Students and their families in the state of Florida. Elementary School students in Grades 1-6 and their families. We expect 1 million plus individuals to be served.

The Ocean Rangers program introduces Grades 1-6 to marine careers through STEAM-based learning while providing middle and high school students with hands-on experience, certifications, and apprenticeships. It fosters career readiness, environmental awareness, and workforce development. Success will be measured through assessments, student engagement, teacher/employer feedback, job placement tracking, and long-term career outcomes to evaluate its impact on education and industry readiness.
