	The CraneRIDES Fleet and Route Expansion project is designed to provide critical access to jobs, services, and essential destinations for under-served communities in Altamonte Springs and the Central Florida region. By expanding the CraneRIDES shuttle service, this project adds a new route and increases fleet size to enhance first/last mile connections to the Altamonte SunRail Station, linking residents to key economic and transit hubs. It serves vital destinations such as AdventHealth, the Altamonte Mall, Cranes Roost Park, affordable housing units, residences and the Boys & Girls Club, enabling access to employment, healthcare, shopping, and recreation. This expansion fosters equity by connecting low-income and disadvantaged communities to economic opportunities, while also supporting regional growth, improving mobility, and strengthening the local economy.

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This funding expands CraneRIDES AV Transit Service with a new route in East Altamonte- an under-served, historically disadvantaged community. It connects residents to the Boys & Girls Club, affordable housing, the Altamonte Mall, and the Altamonte ŠunRail Station—linking them to jobs and economic hubs across the region. This investment fosters equity; strengthens economic mobility; and enhances regional access to employment, commerce, and entertainment.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project includes route development and stop locations, stakeholder collaboration, acquisition of the electric autonomous shuttles to provide the public service. It includes enhancements of stop locations with accessibility features, minor roadway improvements, installation of charging stations, community engagement, testing and quality assurance, and operational training.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The service will provide reliable and accessible transit, particularly for under-served communities, including those without cars or single-car households. This expansion will improve first/last mile connections to the Altamonte SunRail Station, linking residents to key hubs like Altamonte Mall, the Boys & Girls Club, and affordable housing while opening access to jobs and economic opportunities.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project includes residents of East Altamonte, a historically under-served and disadvantaged community, as well as the broader Altamonte Springs and Central Florida Region. This service will particularly benefit individuals without access to personal vehicles, such as those in low-income or single-car households, as well as SunRail and Lynx riders. Additionally, the project serves key destinations such as affordable housing units, the Boys & Girls Club, AdventHealth, and major economic hubs like the Altamonte Mall and Uptown Altamonte. The project is expected to serve approximately 11,000 residents in East Altamonte, providing them with direct access to key transit and economic hubs. The expanded route and fleet will also impact over 20,000 individuals annually, including commuters using SunRail and Lynx, and individuals accessing jobs, healthcare, shopping, and recreational opportunities across Altamonte Springs and the Central Florida region.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The CraneRIDES Fleet and Route Expansion will enhance mobility, economic opportunity, and public safety in Altamonte Springs and Central Florida. By expanding transit access to SunRail, jobs, healthcare, and cultural events, it reduces reliance on costly personal vehicles, fostering financial independence and workforce growth. The project improves public health by increasing physical activity and mental well-being while enhancing safety with autonomous shuttles that reduce crash risks. Benefits will be measured through ridership data, reductions in single-occupancy vehicle use, job access improvements, and economic impact assessments. This investment ensures equitable, sustainable, and efficient transportation, creating lasting regional benefits.

### f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Suggested penalties include financial deductions for unmet deliverables, extended contract periods to allow for project completion without additional compensation, and mandatory corrective action plans. Non-compliance with performance

	measures may result in reduced funding for future projects and potential termination of the contract. These penalties ensure accountability and encourage timely, high-quality project execution.
