The Galileo Early Learning Center will serve infants to children up to 4 years of age with a solid Galileo educational platform that has led to the charter system being A-rated, a certified VPK-8 High Performing Charter School, a FDOE School of Excellence and one of Seminole County's leading schools. The daycare will promote teacher retention by providing both a subsidized and exemplary educational option for Galileo Faculty and Staff.

13. Program Performance



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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The United States is dealing with a nationwide teacher shortage. Many child-bearing teachers choose to stay home after bearing children due to the rising cost of daycare. With the creation of the Galileo Early Learning Center, Galileo Staff will have access to an exemplary early learning educational model, onsite at their school, at a subsidized employee rate of tuition. Galileo teachers will be excited to have their children attend the Galileo Early Learning Center and be more likely to maintain their careers serving the local community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will be used to provide quality daycare options at a subsidized rate for Galileo Teachers and Staff, which will improve teacher retention.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Galileo School Community serves nearly 1400 students in Seminole County, Florida. This project will improve the likelihood that quality teachers will remain in their positions educating these students because their own children will be afforded a wonderful education through the creation of the Galileo Early Learning Center at a subsidized rate of tuition.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

It is estimated that 26 Galileo Staff Members would take advantage of using the Galileo Early Learning Center annually. Those 26 staff members directly impact our 1400 students served across both of the Galileo Campuses by providing an increase in staff retention annually. Over the five year period of this project, thousands of Galileo students and families will be affected positively by the Galileo Early Learning Center.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Employee retention will be improved by 20% through the implementation of this program as it is currently estimated that one in five of the Galileo Teachers and Staff have a child in the age range of the Galileo Early Learning Center. It is anticipated that this subsidized, quality educational option will be widely attractive to staff members. This benefit will be tracked annually through the Galileo School Success Report.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Galileo will strive to create a quality early learning environment that mirrors the success of the two current charter schools. Failing to provide a quality early learning environment that would not be an attractive option for staff would not produce the intended teacher retention outcomes, which in turn would effect the opportunity that the Galileo Community has to receive a desireable high quality education in grades kindergarten through eighth grade.
