a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goals to be achieved through the funds requested are to improve agricultural promotion and education, to improve the quality of education, to increase and improve economic activity, to create specific immediate job opportunities, and to enhance a specific individual's economic self-sufficiency. These goals will be met through the development of the Agricultural Business Associate certification, creation of an industry-aligned exam with comprehensive curriculum and teacher resources to prepare students for roles like Accounting and Financial Clerk.



b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will support developing the Agricultural Business Associate certification and resources. Activities include consulting industry experts to design exam standards, creating a curriculum aligned with the Principles of Agribusiness course, and developing exam materials. Teachers and industry experts will review draft materials to ensure alignment with both classroom and industry needs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will support the creation of resources that will benefit Florida's CTE teachers and students. Direct services include the development of a comprehensive curriculum, exam prep materials, and industry-aligned certification standards. Teachers will access pilot resources for review, ensuring materials meet workforce needs for future implementation.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project includes jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, high school students, and university or college students. We an expecting to serve over 1,000 students across Florida.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

This project will create the Agricultural Business Associate certification framework, including a standards-aligned curriculum focused on agribusiness management and economics concepts. The framework will be assessed through progress tracking on developing certification objectives, curriculum modules, and real-world application examples as well as through feedback from agribusiness experts and teachers involved in pilot reviews. The curriculum will be evaluated for both guality and alignment of curriculum drafts based on detailed reviews by educators, alignment with FL DOE standards, and iterative feedback from teacher focus groups and consultants.
