It will serve as an educational and cultural hub, offering interactive exhibits, school partnerships, and community programs. Additionally, it aims to reduce crime and recidivism by providing pathways to economic stability and community reintegration. The project's success will be measured through tourism and economic impact reports, job creation data, visitor surveys, and school partnerships. Crime reduction will be assessed using crime reports and recidivism rates, while public engagement and well-being will be tracked through community feedback.
