### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The UF Forensic Interview Center will be the center for advanced forensic interviewing education in Florida. It will work with the Department of Health (DOH), to train CPT forensic interviewers; to develop a first of its kind credentialing test and help with its administration; to train on advanced forensic interviewing. The Center will work with FDLE, law enforcement agencies, and Child Advocacy Centers. The goal is to have a center of excellence that assures the most advanced techniques.

- b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
- 1. Advanced training with national experts.
- 2. Test implementation and dissemination with accrediting agency.
- 3. Initial contact training education disseminated to state Attorneys, DCF, some police and others who have contact with children.
- 4. Animal assistance "how to" for CPTs and other agencies.
- 5. Website.
- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The training Center will help front line professionals who do the actual forensic interviewing throughout Florida.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

At-risk youth, developmentally disabled, and victims of crime. >800

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
- 1. Two Seminar with national experts. Define the next generation forensic interviews. Enduring materials generated. Time frame: By May 2026 Conferences occur and recorded material available
- 2. Forensic interview test development and dissemination with accrediting agency. Time frame: June 2026 Test in use and at least 50 test takers
- 3. Initial contact training. State Attorneys, DCF, teachers, some police. Time frame: June 2026 number of trainings
- 4. Therapy Dogs. Therapy dogs have proven useful to help calm children who may be in distress. Rules about their use in Florida vary. A model procedure, supported by legal and psychological research, will be developed for use by jurisdictions in Florida for forensic interviews. Time frame: June 2026
