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This facility will improve the quality and frequency of training available to first responders in our local service area and throughout the state of Florida, with a long-term goal of attracting first responders from around the country. In addition to increasing our current course offerings, new courses will be created and delivered. Palm Beach State College would be happy to partner with state and/or federal agencies in the future in order to collaborate on training, facility space and partnerships that would be beneficial to all parties, in turn, serving and enhancing the safety of our public.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This facility will improve the quality and frequency of training available to first responders in our local service area and throughout the state of Florida, with a long-term goal of attracting first responders from around the country. In addition to increasing our current course offerings, new courses will be created and delivered.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Public safety is an ever-evolving topic. This facility will provide a venue for first responders, as well as state and federal teams to prepare and train together. By providing topical advanced training, we will protect the public through emergency preparedness, as well as appropriate responses to emergencies around our state and the nation.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The direct services will be provided to first responders from the across our state. We anticipate the annual number of students to be approximately 3,000. Indirect services will be to the community. Number of people indirectly served in Palm Beach County is 1.5 million, State of Florida, 22.2 million.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

This facility will improve the quality and frequency of training available to first responders in our local service area and throughout the state of Florida, with a long-term goal of attracting first responders from around the country. In addition to increasing our current course offerings, new courses will be created and delivered. Outcome will be measured by enrollment, the number of agencies served, subject matter offered/sought, and post course surveys completed by students. Additionally, we will seek feedback from public safety partners at the local/state/federal levels to gauge the effectiveness of training offered, and impact to our state's emergency preparedness.
