a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of this project is to address critical stormwater and coastal infrastructure vulnerabilities in the St. Armands Key area. It will address weak points in the stormwater systems in the area, help to improve drainage systems, seawalls and roadway to ensure safety and sustainability during storms and emergencies.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Maximized Mitigation Returns: Every dollar spent on mitigation yields a six-dollar return through reduced recovery and repair costs.

Preservation of Public and Private Assets: Prevents losses to infrastructure, private properties, and businesses, maintaining economic stability.

Economic Continuity: Sustains tax revenue and tourism-driven activities during and after severe weather events. Long-Term Savings: Strengthened infrastructure reduces the need for repeated repairs, saving taxpayer dollars over decades.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Though no direct services will be provided, the citizens will benefit from stormwater and drainage enhancements and roadway improvements.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Cost Savings on Future Disasters: Investments in mitigation now reduce future expenditures from flooding and storm damage by strengthening resilience.

Safeguarding Tourism Revenue: Protects over \$100 million in annual economic activity generated by the St. Armands Key tourism district, ensuring business continuity during disasters.

Enhanced Public Safety: By maintaining evacuation routes, the project ensures the safety of residents and visitors during hurricanes and other emergencies.

Strategic Statewide Alignment: Integrates with Florida's infrastructure resilience goals and complements the Statewide Flooding and Sea Level Rise Resilience Plan.
