Specific components and functions include: Sea Level Monitoring: Provide precise tracking of changes in sea level. Wave Height and Current Sensors: Help in understanding physical dynamics critical to marine navigation and recreation. Water Quality and Nutrient Sensors: Track pollution sources, nutrient loading, and harmful algae bloom precursors. Storm Surge and Drainage Sensors.

The project includes shoreline stabilization, seawall improvements, and drainage enhancements across multiple city-owned properties, including:

- Ken Thompson Park (shoreline stabilization, sidewalk repairs, and lighting upgrades)
- Bird Key Park (seawall and roadway restoration)
- Whitaker Park (pier and seawall improvements)
- Centennial Park (pier and parking lot improvements)
- Saprito Pier and Lido Key (stormwater drainage upgrades)

The project aligns with state and federal guidelines under FEMA and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection to enhance resilience and mitigate damage from future climate and weather-related events.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

Though no direct services will be provided, the citizens will benefit from park improvements, stormwater and drainage enhancements and roadway improvements.
